

Each year the Museum invites six individual artists and thinkers from a range of disciplines to live and work on site, to interact with children through a school partnership program and with visitors through lectures, public performances and exhibitions. This program was designed ten years ago as a means to foster contemporary artistic expression based upon Gardner's stewardship in the arts and her historic collection. A fundamental premise of the Artist-in-Residence Program is that participants will find some aspect of the Museum that sparks new thinking and inspires their work. In Spring 2000, Owens spent one month at the Museum as an Artist-in-Residence. During her stay she wandered about the museum galleries, visited the textile conservation lab and painted in a studio space off-site. She was influenced by the Museum's paintings, drawings and especially the textiles and fabrics, which she explored in depth with the help of the textile conservators. Her exposure to the Museum collection and its installation are reflected in the works displayed in the gallery and in the artist book that accompanies the exhibit. Laura Owens-New Work at the Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum has been published by Charta Editori, Milan, and is available at the Museum Shop.
